Global Community Mourns Loss of Nobel Peace Laureate, Norman E. Borlaug

Norman Ernest Borlaug, the 1970 Nobel Peace Prize winner for developing high-yielding, disease-resistant wheat used to prevent famine in developing countries throughout the world, died Saturday, September 14, 2009 in Dallas of cancer at the age of 95.

Borlaug, who dedicated his life to employing science to combat hunger, was Distinguished Professor of International Agriculture in Texas A&M University's Department of Soil and Crop Sciences.

Memorable Experience of My First ASABE & AOCABFE Meeting

Thanks to Prof. Roger Ruan's invitation and hosting, I had the opportunity to work at the University of Minnesota as a visiting scholar from May to December, 2009. I also took this opportunity to attend 2009 ASABE Annual International

Meeting and to participate in the Association of Overseas Chinese Agricultural, Biological and Food Engineers (AOCABFE, short as AOC) activities in Reno, Nevada, USA during June 19-24, 2009. This is my first visit to the U.S., and also my first attendance to the ASABE annual meeting. What a wonderful and unforgettable experience in my professional life!

Because of the serious pandemic of swine flu this year, many Chinese professionals could not come to the ASABE meeting, and I became the only representative from the headquarter of the Chinese Society of Agricultural Engineering (CSAE) and the Chinese Academy of Agricultural Engineering (CAAE). Thus, the president of both CSAE and CAAE, Professor Zhu Ming entrusted me to address the meeting on behalf of the CSAE, the CAAE and himself. I was honored to be an invited speaker to give a presentation on the China Exchange Session jointly sponsored by ASABE and AOCABFE. In the morning of June 23, I made a presentation entitled "Overview of Scientific Journals in China and International English Journal IJABE Based on Open Access". I concluded my talk by thanking and encouraging AOCABFE members to support our joint journal IJABE with an acronym "PRC", which stands for "Publish your good papers in the IJABE, Review the manuscripts for the IJABE if asked, and Cite the papers published in the IJABE. Your support to the IJABE

with the "PRC" is also your contribution to China, because the People's Republic of China is often referred to as the PRC.

We also held the first IJABE editorial board meeting during the ASABE meeting. The then AOCABFE president Dr. Zhongli Pan and the past AOCABFE president Dr. Chenghai Yang made a great effort in organizing and coordinating the editorial board meeting in advance. As a result, about twenty participants attended the meeting. Dr. Chenghai Yang chaired the meeting, and I, one of the Managing Editors, gave the annual report with the title of "IJABE based on Open Access and Open Journal System: Annual Report". After the presentation, there were good discussion and exchanges on some key issues, including timely peer review, website access, uploading and downloading website files, and how to attract enough good quality submissions, etc. Great success and rapid growth of the IJABE were well recognized, and good suggestions and practical measures for improving the journal were presented. The other managing editor Dr. Paul Chen made a special trip to attend this editorial board meeting on behalf of the Co-Editor-in-Chief, Professor Roger Ruan. To ensure a successful editorial board meeting, Professor Ruan organized an editorial staff meeting in advance at the University of Minnesota, and some color flyers were printed and distributed to meeting attendees to increase exposure of the IJABE to more colleagues during the ASABE meeting.

In addition to giving the two presentations, I also attended the AOCABFE Business Meeting and Award Banquet, and the Dinner Party for Overseas Alumni of College of Biosystems Engineering and Food Science, Zhejiang University, China. During

these meetings and banquets, I gave congratulation and greeting speeches on behalf of Professor Zhu Ming and the CSAE, and welcomed and invited all overseas Chinese experts to attend the 2009 CSAE Annual Meeting in Shanxi Province during August 22-24. Moreover, I attended 2009 ASABE Benefit Celebration Dinner and Awards Luncheon, and was deeply moved and impressed by so many outstanding AOCABFE members. I am very proud of them.

I enjoyed the wonderful time during the ASABE and AOCABFE meetings in Reno. Besides listening to many reports, I also met many old friends and made some new friends, such as Professors and Drs. 2009 AOCABFE Annual Business Meeting was held in Reno, NV from 6:00pm to 7:30pm on Monday, June 22, 2009. Dr. Ning Wang, AOCABFE Vice President, chaired the meeting. More than 70 AOCABFE members and guests attended the meeting.

- 1. Dr. Ning Wang called the meeting in order and welcomed all the attendees.
- Approval Meeting Agenda
 Dr. Hongwei Xin moved to approve the 2009
 AOCABFE Annual Business Meeting agenda.
 Dr. Naiqian Zhang seconded the move. The
 agenda was approved.
- 3. Dr. Ning Wang and Dr. Zhongli Pan introduced guests from China and from the Consulate General of the People's Republic of China in San Francisco, respectively.
- 4. Approval of 2008 AOCABFE Business Meeting Minutes
 Dr. Hongwei Xin made a move to approve 2008 AOCABFE Business Meeting Minutes distributed in the meeting. Dr. Ruihong Zhang seconded the move. The move was passed and the Minutes was approved.
- President Report
 Dr. Zhongli Pan, 2008-2009 AOCABFE
 President, reported AOCABFE's work during
 last one year. Firstly, Dr. Pan sincerely
 expressed his thanks to all people who worked
 for, helped, and supported AOCABFE. Then,

Dr. Pan read a letter from Professor Maohua Wang. In his letter, Professor Wang expressed his greetings to all AOCABFE members and congratulated on AOCABFE's success in the previous year. After that, Dr. Pan summarized AOCABFE's accomplishment in various aspects in last year including AOCABFE membership, collaboration with China and outreach, fundraising, journal publication, network and exchange, Newsletter, and website. Finally, Dr. Pan congratulated AOCABFE member, Dr. Yanbin Li, on his being elected as ASABE Fellow at 2009 ASABE Annual International Meeting.

Are We Using Right AOCABFE Official Name?

关于统一AOCABFE对外交流的中英文名称的建议

It is important to use a right and consistent title for our association. Association of Overseas Chinese Agricultural, Biological, and Food Engineers (AOCABFE) as a professional society should have its consistent official title in both

English and Chinese. Its English name has been used properly and consistently. However, I found that the official Chinese name has not been used consistently in AOCABFE website, newsletter IMPACT or somewhere else. There are several (at least eight) versions of the Chinese name for AOCABFE. To avoid confusion in use of the AOCABFE name, I strongly suggest that a formal and consistent official name of AOCABFE in both English and Chinese be used for international exchange.

俗话说,名不正言不顺。作为一个学术团体, 应该有一个统一的对外交流的名称。不论在对 外的正式书面文件,还是口语交流,都应该使 用统一规范的名称,以避免混乱,同时也有利 于开展有效的交流与合作。据初步观察,协会 的英文名称相对固定,但中文名称有多个版本 (至少有如下8种),使用不统一的名称,造成 交流上的混乱,同时也可能让人感觉作为学术 机构的我们似乎不够严谨,影响形象。

其中应关注的细节问题包括: 1) 明确用"协会 "还是"学会"; 2)中间的标点应该用顿号(中文中特有,英文中没有),而不应用"逗号 (中英文输入状态不同, 打印出的逗号不一 样);3)是否有"技术"二字,对应的英文似 乎没有, 仅为"生物", 因此建议不用"生物 技术"; 4) 建议用"海外华人",而不用"海 外中国"; 5) 连接词时而用"和"、"与", 时而用"及",我建议用"与",不赞成用" 及"。因为"及"在汉语理解上似乎有辅助、 附属、补充等负面含义,如未及、企及、不及 格、鞭长莫及、不及其余、言不及义、仙及鸡 犬等。套用成语"一人飞升,仙及鸡犬",是 否"农业与生物工程师飞升,仙及食品工程师 "? 显然不是! 我理解, 协会中几类工程师应 是平等并列的,无优劣之分,等次之别。

综上分析,本人建议,采用以上第8种方案作为对外交流的统一的中文表述,即"海外华人农业、生物与食品工程师协会"。英文的名称,在文本/件第一次出现时写明全称并括注首字母缩写,然后在后文中使用缩写AOCABFE,即 Association of Overseas Chinese Agricultural, Biological, and Food Engineers (AOCABFE),注意其中的"逗号"为英文状态下输入的符号。但在口语交流中可以使用

AOC指代协会。
